AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT RATES FOR WATER, SEWER, AND GAS OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen for the City of Lexington are responsible for the efficient management and operation of Water, Wastewater, and Gas Departments; and,

WHEREAS, to comply with Tennessee Code Annotated and provide for a financially viable water and sewer system,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, TENNESSEE THAT:

SECTION 1: This ordinance will replace in entirety the current rate and fee schedules for water, wastewater, and gas services.

SECTION 2: The following rates and fees shall be adopted for use by Lexington Water Systems and Lexington Gas System:

SECTION 3: The above rates and fees shall go into effect with all bills and charges issued as of June 1, 2025 and thereafter.

SECTION 4: Water and Sewer Automatic Adjustment of Rates to Reflect Cost of Living. The Water Rates for Meter Charge, Maintenance Fee, Technology Fee, and Consumption Rate; and, the Sewer Rates for Customer Charge, Usage Rate, and Flat Rate shall be adjusted on an annual basis in an amount equal to the percentage increase change in the COLA (Social Security Cost-Of-Living Adjustment) for the prior calendar year. Said annual adjustment shall be effective with the bills issued in July each year, beginning July 2026. The Board of Mayor and Aldermen may reject the automatic adjustment by passage of a resolution for a specific fiscal year prior to the beginning of that year.

SECTION 5: Sewer Rate Adjustment. The customer charge for all inside city sewer customers shall increase by \$7.00 effective with all bills issued as of June 1, 2026 and thereafter.

SECTION 6: Gas Automatic Adjustment of Rates to Reflect Cost of Living. The Base Rate used in billing volume per mcf's as set out in the schedule of rates listed in Section 2 shall be adjusted on an annual basis in an amount equal to the percentage change in the COLA (Social Security Cost-Of-Living Adjustment) for the prior calendar year. Said annual adjustment shall be effective with the bills issued in July each year, beginning July 2026. The Board of Mayor and Aldermen may reject the automatic adjustment by passage of a resolution for a specific fiscal year prior to the beginning of that year.

SECTION 7: Gas Rate Adjustment. The customer charge for all residential and small commercial gas customers shall increase by \$3.30 effective with all bills issued as of June 1, 2026 and thereafter.

SECTION 8: Maintenance Fee. The Maintenance Fee shall be designated for the maintenance, operation and replacement of water storage facilities and hydrants.

SECTION 9: Technology Fee. The Technology Fee shall be designated for the maintenance, operation and replacement of smart meters, SCADA, and other system monitoring equipment.

^{*} Loaded trucks with capacity above 7,500 gallons will not be accepted without written approval by the WWTP Chief Operator, whereby a disposal fee will be provided for each specific load.

SECTION 10: Other Fees. Other Fees shall be adjusted only on an "as needed basis" as part of the annual budget, and with any increase being approved by ordinance of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen. Other Fees include Tap Fees, Fire Protection Fees, Septic Dump Fees, and other miscellaneous fees as listed on the above Fee Schedule.

SECTION 11: This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, the public welfare requiring it.
